

#### Pastor's Note

A few days ago I was watching a newscast when they reported that this coming summer was going to be hot, even hotter than last year. They spoke of how miserable it was going to be and how it would negatively affect everything from the homeless to tourism. Then they gave their evidence, which was that the Farmer's Almanac was predicting a 30% chance that this coming summer will be hotter than last year.

I laughed quietly and shook my head at the silliness of the whole report. If there is a 30% chance of being hotter, then there is a 70% chance of being cooler. That means it is more than twice as likely by their estimate that it will not be as hot. Yet they spun the whole thing to emphasize how terrible it could be.

Summertime in Arizona is like that. People anticipate the worst. They plan to be miserable. And of all the things you plan for, the negative ones are the most likely to come to fruition. Many people expect for as much as possible to shut down and for all non-essentials, and even some really important things, to be on hold until the weather cools down.

Even around the church, there is a real current towards doing less. But I don't believe we should follow that trend. God is still in heaven. Still on His throne. Still deserves to be praised. We should not back down. Yes it carries some minor inconveniences to be out in the heat, but so what. People need fellowship, even if the group is smaller. Others need to hear the gospel, and without a crowd it's easier to focus on them.

God can still change hearts, even in the summertime. But, He needs us to stay active in order to use us in His life-changing work. I think that the unchurched who stay here year round, might well be more open to hearing the gospel in the stretch of time when the streets, restaurants and social centers are not as busy.

And it seems to me that God is doing some remarkable things in our world. The University of Alabama recently had a mass baptism event. Notice this is not a Christian school. Other schools have seen their collegiate ministries increase greatly. We have also seen God moving in our church, in ways that I cannot explain other than pointing to God and saying He is moving.

Do we want to put God on hold? Nope. That would be unwise. So, those of you that are year rounders, keep coming, keep your scheduled events, keep witnessing and keep inviting. Then behind the scenes, keep studying, and keep praying – specifically to ask God to keep doing the things only He can do.

## **Building and Grounds**

The B & G Committee in conjunction with Kelli in the Church office is responsible for the physical condition of GCBC facilities to assure a safe and economic environment for all church functions.

Through the first four months of 2024, the Committee reviewed and either confirmed or approved funding requests from Kelli for maintenance and/or improvements to various aspects of the church facilities. Some of the major items addressed included treatment for termites in the area above the janitor's closet in the Worship Center (WC) foyer, fire service system maintenance, plumbing repairs in WC bathrooms, all AC unit maintenance and filter replacement, door adjustments in WC and Ministry Center (MC) including two new door closures. The committee will continue to monitor the conditions of the facilities with Kelli and respond to the needs accordingly.

The Lord has blessed us with great facilities in which to worship together. **HOWEVER**, we do have another need and request the help of our congregation. The B & G committee is responsible for the position of "Facilities Access Manager". This position refers to the role of unlocking the church facilities around 8 am on Sunday morning and confirming all doors and lights are out in the facilities after the morning service. Also, the position includes unlocking the classroom in the MC on Monday evening around 6 pm for the AA group to meet and returning around 8 pm to lock the classroom door and check the lights. Kent Edwards has fulfilled these duties with the utmost dedication for the past year or more and will be taking a break this summer thus the need for one or more candidates to fill the need. The time required to accomplish the tasks is minimal and the position is compensated. If interested, feel free to contact me or the church office.

Carol Thompson and I filled in when Kent was away at different times. If time permits, we can arrange a meeting with candidates and include Kent and Carol if needed for more information. There is a job description available to help direct those who may seek more information. Although there is a need for late April into mid-May, the real need is from June 2 through September 2. After that time, we hope to address the position with multiple candidates so that the burden is not on one person to fulfill the duties.

# **Musically Speaking**



Why do we sing in church? More broadly, why is music such a consistent part of what we do when we gather together weekly?

Some churches treat their music as little more than a warm-up act for the sermon. Others seem to view it like a weekly concert that's intended to get new

visitors in the doors, or a time of familiarity and nostalgia. But I believe there are many other vital functions church music plays besides only these, some of those functions being:

- Worship First and foremost, our music is to be *to* and *for* our Lord. Worship is broader than just music, but when we do music, it must be as an aspect of our worship.
- Prayer Sometimes the acronym ACTS has been used to give a model for our praying: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication. A Christian song's lyrics can incorporate any or all of these types of prayers to God.
- Response & Interaction A significant part of a church service is spent listening, but communication—even in our relationship with God—is a two-way street. Our singing is a way that we get to corporately respond to and interact with our Lord.
- Teaching & Reinforcing When music in a church context includes words, those words should of course be communicating biblically sound truths. The hymns of the faith were a formative part of my upbringing and learning about God, and I hope they will be for my little one as well. But we adults aren't all-knowing either; we too still have much to learn about God and His Word, and our songs can help us with this. Speaking of which...
- Memorizing Aid A song is how I first learned the 10 Commandments, and later how I memorized the Fruit of the Spirit. Perhaps it's how you have learned various Scripture passages too. There's just something about music that, for many of us, can help commit things to memory.
- Reminder In the Old Testament, Israel had altars, monuments, and annual feasts as readily available reminders of what God had done for them. One such altar was Samuel's Ebenezer or "stone of remembrance" in 1 Sam. 7:12. Today, songs are one way we can incorporate regular reminders into our own lives. "Here I raise my Ebenezer; hither by Thy help I'm come..." (from "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing," by Robert Robinson)
- Testimony Some songs, such as "Come Thou Fount," also serve as testimonies, providing opportunities to testify to others what God has done in our lives.
- Agreement Generally speaking, our song lyrics are areas of theological agreement for us as a church, concepts that we are able to affirm together as shared beliefs.
- Aspiration Sometimes a song's words or promises that we utter to God may sound so unattainable, we may wonder why we bothered saying them in the first place. "<u>All</u> to Jesus I Surrender"? But such songs lay out eternity-focused goals we aspire to; though we may never manage to perfectly achieve these goals in this life, lyrics like this can be a specific *type* of supplicational prayer, pleading with God to help us better love and follow Him. This coming Sunday as we once again exercise the joy and privilege of singing together, perhaps you might ask yourself about each song, "Which functions does this song serve in my life?"

#### **Mission News**

Thanks to the generosity of Grand Community Baptist Church members, we are able to support various missions and ministries locally, state-wide, and globally.

#### **Love Baptist Church-**

The ongoing monthly First Sunday Share will be collected on May 5 and June 2 in the designated area of the church lobby. Gently used textiles, furniture, toys, clothing, linens, household and kitchen items, working electronics and other useful items are welcome for donation. These donations provide needed essentials for our inner-city sister church members where distribution occurs on a weekly or as-needed basis within the community in which it serves. Our sister church was established as a mission church by North Phoenix Baptist Church in 1950. Upcoming events include: school supply collection in July, Trunk or Treat Halloween ministry in October and Angel Tree ministry in December. More information will be forthcoming at a later date.

## **Prayer Request-**

The Missions Committee has been informed of a prayer request from an IMB missionary (Angel) whom we support, ministering in Nigeria as a teacher at the Baptist College of Theology. Please pray for the six missionaries still ministering there (out of 400.) Pray for the soybean and well-digging projects, the inflation rate, kidnappings, and for Angel's mother as she recovers from a recent surgery.

## Arizona Baptist Children's Services (ABCS)-

The mission of the Arizona Baptist Children's Services is to provide hope and care to hurting children and families through Christ-centered ministries. ABCS ministries focus on providing practical help to meet physical, emotional, and spiritual needs. Their goal is to share the love of Christ with each person with whom they come in contact. Those services include: an adult ministry, counselling ministry, food and clothing ministry, foster care ministry, parent aid ministry (working in association with the Arizona Department of Child Safety), pregnancy ministry and transitional program ministry. The Bridge Church partners with ABCS, serving the under-served. On May 19, a representative from ABCS will be sharing their ministry needs in our morning worship service at which time we encourage members to prayerfully consider giving a love offering.
