The doctrine of "the priesthood of the believer" has long been a hallmark of Baptist theology. The veil separating us from the Holy of Holies, from the presence of God, has been torn open (see Matt. 27:50-51a; Heb. 10:19-20). God wants a relationship with each of us, and He wants to hear from us directly! So we are not called to be merely observers during corporate worship, but participants.

As fortunate as our church is with talented and hard-working musicians—such as our instrumentalists, soloists, or choir-and as much as they bless us with God-honoring songs, it's still my belief that congregational singing is the "crown jewel" of our musical worship together precisely because of its togetherness, because of the direct involvement of all the saints present. In saying this, I am not diminishing our musicians' skill or effort. Rather, I am encouraging you not to underestimate the importance of what you contribute to the musical portion of our worship!

As Psalm 105:1-2 says, "Sing to Him, sing praises to Him; tell of all His wonders. Glory in His holy name; may the heart of those who seek the Lord be joyful." May this passage accurately portray what we do as we gather together!

# **Church Safety and Security**

The Safety and Security Plan for GCBC was developed by the Church Safety and Security planning team and approved by GCBC members in 2018. The Plan was developed in conjunction with input gathered from the City of Surprise Faith Leadership conferences and site visits from the City of Surprise Neighborhood Police Dept. representative.

As with any plan, success is dependent on implementation and enforcement by the team put in place. Currently, the GCBC Security Team is composed of seven dedicated volunteers including one member with extensive experience in law enforcement. We propose that two Security Team members including the ex-law enforcement member are on duty at the Sunday morning service and at least one member available at the Wednesday and Sunday evening services.

If requested, a Security Team member will be available for other special services other than the normal scheduled days. Our team becomes over-taxed during the summer months as three of the regular members leave for their summer homes thus affecting the normal schedule of the other team members during May through September.

Our Team could really use some additional volunteers during that time frame to help relieve the schedule burden of the reduced team members. No prior experience is necessary, and Ladies are welcome to join the Team.

#### Missions

The mission committee distributes funds which givers have designated to "missions" on their offering envelopes. Biblically, we should first give a tithe (10%) to the budget of the church, but many people give beyond a tithe including to the missions.

These designated funds are separate from the special churchwide mission offerings of the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering, the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, or the Arizona Mission Offerings. These 3 offerings are sent directly to the appropriate organization through our treasurer with the aid of the church office. The mission committee does play a role in setting these 3 offering goals and in promoting the offerings.

The designated mission funds are also separate from the general budget mission percentages given to the Cooperative Program, and the Estrella Baptist Association. These are set levels of giving through the church budget which are reviewed each year and voted on by the church body.

One of the missions/ministries in Arizona that our church donates to through your generosity of designated funds is the Along Side Ministries (ASM). Their motto is Seeing Lives Transformed. This is a prison ministry serving in 12 prisons, 21 yards (divisions within the prison's population). ASM is in both men's and women's prison yards.

2023 Highlights include: at the Perryville Carlos yard- 300 to 500 women attended a worship service in November led by a Goodyear church. 974 discipleship group sessions were held, 372 new professions in Christ were celebrated, 513 mentor/mentee sessions occurred, and 41 baptisms were witnessed -15 from a women's Bible meeting where 115 women were present. The Lord used 106 ASM volunteers serving 14, 295 hours in 2023 to accomplish His work among the prisons.

As a church we give this group \$300 monthly/\$3600 a year. Please pray for this ministry to help transform the lives it serves in the AZ prisons and for the Christians within the prisons as they grow in faith and allow Jesus to impact their lives moving forward. # **Mission Projects for April**

#### If you choose to participate, we have 2 opportunities to impact lives for the God's Kingdom.

- 1) The Arizona City church we have contact with, has a need of 40 sturdy backpacks for children in grades K-6 for the school year 24-25. The plan is to give the backpacks to the children that attend the church's VBS in June. We will collect the backpacks April 7 through 28.
- 2) The baby bottle campaign--- grab a provided baby bottle to fill with loose change or cash/ check to assist with the work of The Choices Pregnancy Center to inform women of their choices in the case of an unwanted or untimely pregnancy. Choices provides emotional support for both the woman, if possible, the man. There are Lifepath classes for parents, free emergency baby supplies/clothes, free ultrasounds, and more.

# **A Note From The Gideons**

It was a great blessing to be a part of your worship service on Sunday, February 4<sup>th</sup>. The warm and gracious reception on behalf of Grand Community Baptist Church was genuinely appreciated.

Your congregation's love for a lost world and the Word of God is exciting to see. A praying body has tremendous impact in seeing others come to Christ. The generous offering that was given in the amount of \$2,245 demonstrates the faithfulness of God in the partnership between your church and The Gideons International. These funds will be used in their entirety to provide about 1,440 Scriptures in areas served by Gideons, both locally and across the globe. Please pray for many people to come to faith in Jesus Christ through these Scriptures.



In 2023, our church provided 286 boxes for OCC, 82 boxes built with shipping covered by individuals (including 1 built and shipped online) and 204 boxes through church donations of supplies and shipping funds.

The team used all the funds donated to build quality boxes and send as many boxes as we could for this once in a lifetime gift. The boxes are generally handed out at a celebrative event at the local church sponsor in the receiving country.

It is exciting that the gospel story was told to the children and any family present. The boxes that were traceable through the Follow Your Box label program all went to the Philippines.

The one box built through the OCC website, went to a hard to reach and unpublished country. Pray for the children who received a box and their families that Christ will be made known among them.
