If I had been one of the shepherds, I would have been just like them. In the dark of a Judean night, long before electric lights and far exceeding the ability of torches, or their meager campfire, they were suddenly bathed in the light of the glory of heaven. It must have been terrifying enough just by the brightness. Then within the illumination is manifested the appearance of angels. These warriors of heaven were not the baby-faced cherubs sometimes portrayed. Instead, they would have been more terrifying than the unexplainable brightness.

News from the Mission Field



Angel, one of our missionaries from West Africa, wrote updates about the funds our church gave her through the love offering we gave when she visited us last August.

She purchased 100 plastic desks and chairs for the women's department at the college. The cost was \$1500. These will replace the heavy wooden desks

which were very uncomfortable for the students'



wives, especially those expecting babies soon. There is joy in the women's group over the chairs. Angel will likely put some of the funds toward 2 wells at \$600 each, then put the rest of the funds toward some of the many current needs.



In addition, the Mission Committee donated \$1200 to Angel's team for 2 wells to be dug (wells are hand dug) for the displaced refugees in her region. On November 17th, Angel sent word the rainy season has ended, and they have started digging the 2 wells. One digging project has hit water already for which Angel wrote, "Praise God"! There will be joy expressed when the wells are finished from those needing the water source. May they find the Living Water through the new wells and the presentation of the Gospel.

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) Update

The OCC tag line is "Delivering Great Joy and the Good News of Jesus Christ"



With great joy the OCC project team announces an additional box was able to be packed with shipping covered and 4 boxes were able to be built online through the OCC website. These 5 boxes, added to the 330 boxes the church commissioned on Nov 10th, bring the total of boxes sent this year to 335! This number is due to your

generosity as GCBC members and attendees as you have given supplies and funds to support this ministry. Thank you for making it possible for 335 children to receive a once in a lifetime OCC shoebox gift, to hear and respond to the Gospel, and the potential to join the Greatest Journey 12-week discipleship training course. Pray that the children's and potentially their families' lives will impacted by Jesus through the Gospel message that goes along with each box. Pray each box makes the journey safely into the child's hands it is meant for. Watch for information in the next several weeks regarding the region(s) of the world the boxes will head to.

Lottie Moon Christmas Offering – The Great Pursuit

Christmas means the Lottie Moon Offering for our International Missionaries has arrived. The month of December there will be videos highlighting some of the missionaries' service in various places around the world. The theme is The Great Pursuit. Our offering goal this year is \$15,000. *Pray about what you will give toward this goal.*



A little information about this offering. named after Charlotte (Lottie) Diggs Moon, who did not accept the Jesus as her Savior until she was in college. Actually, Lottie was opposed to the Lord and fought Him for quite a while. Lottie turned down marriage and followed the Lord's call on her heart to go to China. When she was 32 years old, she was appointed a missionary to China on July 7, 1873, she survived the Boxer Rebellion or 1900-1901, was in China 40 years, before sailing home to Virgina, due to illness in 1912. She died on the ship while it docked in Kobe, Japan on Dec 24, 1912.

There is much more to Lottie and her experiences, but it would take a book to tell of her life. Lottie was a contemporary of Annie Walker Armstrong, here in the US, and together these women made a lasting impact on Southern Baptist Missions at home and abroad. They are both honored with the naming of our two Southern Baptist national missionary week of prayer emphasis and offerings after them.
