#### Pastor's Note

Then He said to them, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men."

#### Matthew 4:19

A long time ago on the other side of the country, a deacon wanted to talk with me about a family problem. I knew what it

was about. I thought it better to let him tell me, than I tell him. Yet he could be real quiet. Especially about a matter like this. So, he invited me to go fishing.

We sat on a boat together on Sandy Creek, mostly in silence. He occasionally talked about fishing, rather than talking about what was on his mind. He asked about my experience with it. He learned that I had never enjoyed it, mostly because I rarely caught anything.

He gave me the most amazing advice about fishing I have ever heard. Like a lot of good advice it doesn't sound like much until it's put into practice. He knew exactly where the fish were. I was a little surprised, the surface of the water gave no hints I could read. So, I 'took his bait' and asked him where the fish were.

He answered, "The fish are in the water."

I might have laughed, or I might have scoffed, but either way he pointed out how much of the time I had spent on the boat with my line out of the water. Checking it, changing it, chasing it. If I wanted to catch anything, I would have to put my line back in the water and patiently let it stay there. Sheepishly I did.

And sheepishly he began to talk about his problem. As we talked, we floated downstream under The Parkway Bridge. My pole suddenly bent erratically back and we both went silent. I reeled in the first fish and realized he had one on his line as well. We spent the next hour tied up there catching fish after fish. Later we finished the discussion on his fears and together we prayed them into submission.

Ever since I started taking his advice on where the fish are, I have really enjoyed fishing. The right line, the right prayers, all make the difference. But nothing makes the difference like keeping your line in the water.

Don't let the devil tell you that Jesus made Simon Peter into a fisher of men, but He only made you into a sitter of pews. Sitters of pews make Christianity boring, but fishers of men experience the adventure of serving the Most High God.

Every follower of Jesus Christ is called to be a fisher of men. The same God is at work in you as was at work in Simon Peter. Keep your line in the water and eventually you will feel that distinctive tug.

But it seems that we are too busy doing things that we think we need to do. Maybe we need to be more like Mary who sat at the feet of Jesus and just enjoyed being with Him. If we are too busy to spend time with the Lord, maybe we have confused what is urgent with what is important. It is important to listen to the truth from God's Word rather

than the lies from the enemy.

Chuck Lawless shares "6 Lies of the Enemy that will Stunt Your Spiritual Growth."

- 1. **Did God really say that?** This was the first of the lies ever told to mankind by the enemy. Eve was enticed by it as the devil tried to convince her that God's Word could not be trusted.
- 2. You are inadequate. The truth is that God has equipped you to do all that He has called you to do.
- 3. You will never be able to overcome that sin in your life. You will always be a sinner. As children of God, we have been declared righteous and forgiven. We are no longer sinners. Nowhere in Scripture are we declared sinners after we are saved. Instead, we are victorious overcomers through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. You have to be perfect./ Sin is not a big deal. Some of us buy into the lie that we have to be perfect in order for God to love us. But remember that Jesus died for us while we were still sinners, so we know this to be a lie. Sin is not a big deal. Jesus did not die on the cross to deal with something that was "no big deal." The enemy likes to use both of these extreme views of sin to handicap our growth in Christ.
- 5. You can't trust God in all things. Some things you simply have to handle yourself. How often do we try to handle things ourselves before taking them to God? And we make a mess of the situation.
- 6. Fellowship with other Believers is optional . . .a good idea perhaps but not necessary. Your relationship with God is a personal one, but that doesn't mean God meant for you to be all on your own. In fact, He designed you for quite the opposite. We are called the Church and the Body of Christ for a reason. We are destined to work together in unity and harmony. Not only that but we NEED each other.

# When Jesus was tempted by Satan. He quoted God's Word. It is important for us to memorize God's Word. *"Your Word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You"* (Psalm 119:11).

#### **BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE**

As we enter the second quarter of 2025, our committee is blessed with new members who are willing to get involved with the many aspects of keeping our great campus running smoothly. The B & G Committee is a support mechanism for Kelli Ruiz, Facilities Manager for GCBC who relies on our expertise for support, advice and approval of vendor estimates for continued maintenance and implementation of new projects as needed for our facilities that are now over 20 (WC) and 10 (MC) years old.

In the first quarter of this year, regular annual maintenance has been completed for trimming of the Palo Verde trees, irrigation system repairs and upgrades, repairs and maintenance of all HVAC systems, fire suppression systems and other on-call visits for minor maintenance and operational needs. Also, a new handicap door was installed at the south entrance of the Foyer in the Worship Center.

Hopefully, by the time you receive the June Newsletter, two other major improvements will have been made as follows:

- 1. Installation of two new handicap door systems in the FH area of the Ministry Center.
- 2. Installation of new overhead LED lights and covers in the Worship Center Foyer and the back areas of the Sanctuary.

Memorial Garden Bench- the Family of Lorraine Hart and Barbara Payne made a donation to the church for a memorial bench and plaque to honor these two loved ones. The bench will be located in front of the Worship Center in an open area left of the south door to the Foyer. The bench will be placed on landscape pavers for better access. We thank our church landscape vendor, RJ Landscaping, for clearing that area of irrigation lines, donating and placement of the pavers at no cost.

The B & G Committee looks forward to serving GCBC the remainder of the calendar year in a way to honor the Lord as we use the great facilities we are blessed to have and serve him.

#### Women's Saturday Bible Study

This Women's Bible study will take June and July off. Watch for the next study in August/September. The women, who attend the study, plan on meeting a couple times for a meal during June and July.

The last study this spring was on the Queen of Sheba. We enjoyed the study and want to share some info with you. Did you know she is mentioned both in the Old and New Testaments?

Some facts about Sheba, the Queen from the South, and historical context about this queen and her area. Her story is noted in both 1Kings 10:1-12 and in 2 Chronicles 9:1-13. Chronicles contains some of the history of Israel in genealogical and narrative fashion. Likely Sheba was from what is now current day Yemen. She would have traveled between 1200 to 1500 miles to meet Solomon in Jerusalem. Her massive load of gifts for Solomon would have included a huge entourage to manage and protect the caravan. The gold alone was 4.5 tons (9,000 pounds). The travel one way was likely 2 months to get to Jerusalem then 2 months there as camels are known to need at least that much time to recover and regain their physical strength and then 2 months home. Can you imagine the amount of time in preparation of the items then packing for all people, animals, and gifts for this massive undertaking? She also had to prepare her kingdom to function while she was gone.

Her motive for this travel: 1 Kings 1:10 she "heard about the fame of Solomon and his relationship to the LORD. She came to test Solomon with hard questions". It is thought she may have also wanted to work out some trade deals as well for her people. Solomon was the richest king likely of all time. Blessed by God at least at this time in his life. He asked for wisdom and knowledge in governing his people and the LORD gave it to him and more. A thousand years after Solomon, his clothing is mentioned in the New Testament (Luke 12:27 and in Matthew) and still we are talking about it 2000 more years later. Can you imagine his wealth? The Bible notes the Sheba was overwhelmed by Solomon's vast wealth and she attributed his wealth to the LORD.

Sheba met with Solomon over the months, she and the people and animals she brought were guests of Solomon's and by custom, he would have housed them in some way. Sheba gave him her massive gifts at the end of her visit, and he would have given her parting gifts per custom.

Interestingly during the stay—Sheba praised Solomon's God. She came from a multiple god pagan culture, but she settled on the One True God during her stay. The proof- that she praised God, she used God's name He gave Moses to address Him, Yahweh, written as LORD. Then Jesus mentions her in Matthew 12:42/Luke 11:31 as being present at the judgement. "The Queen of the South will rise up in the judgment with the men of this generation and condemn them, for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and indeed, a greater than Solomon *is* here."

It is thought that she took Yahweh back with her to Yemen and spread the news about God. The proof of this-- there has historically been Jews in Yemen area until their emigration, called Operation Magic Carpet, which occurred in June 1949-September 1950. Now, Yemen belongs to the Islamic culture.

Another interesting set of verses: Solomon's dedication prayer for the temple is recorded in 1 Kings 8:22-61. Look at verse 41-43. "As for the foreigner who does not belong to your people Israel but has come from a distant land because of your name—<sup>42</sup> for they will hear of your great name and your mighty hand and your outstretched arm—when they come and pray toward this temple, <sup>43</sup> then hear from heaven, your dwelling place. Do whatever the foreigner asks of you, so that all the peoples of the earth may know your name and fear you, as do your own people Israel, and may know that this house I have built bears your Name." Sheba visited sometime after this and sought to know about Solomon's God.

This info on Sheba was supplied by the Bible and gleaned from the study by Liz Curtis Higgs, "It's Good to Be Queen, Becoming as Bold, Gracious, and Wise as the Queen of Sheba". This study includes 9 pages of references from the Bible and scholars. A few verses can have a lot to say in God's Word.
